Launched in September 2018, the SingHealth Duke-NUS Global Health Institute (SDGHI) harnesses the strengths and expertise of SingHealth and Duke-NUS Medical School to advance global health activities in the region and globally.

WHAT WE DO

RESEARCH

SDGHI seeks to improve health outcomes and reduce the burden of disease through support of evidence-based research. To this end, we facilitate research partnerships, fund pilot research grants for faculty and build the onsite research capability of our collaborating partners. Our initial research priorities are: (1) communicable diseases, particularly of viral origin; (2) non-communicable diseases, such as cancer, cardiovascular disease and eye disease; and (3) health services research.

POLICY

SDGHI aims to position itself and Singapore as a regional hub for policy engagement and thought leadership. It strives to develop health policy excellence on important global health issues such as universal health coverage, health security and substandard and counterfeit drugs. It does this through leveraging on SDGHI's faculty expertise and its relationships with regional Ministries of Health, international organisations and key opinion leaders.

EDUCATION & TRAINING

SDGHI is developing comprehensive education and training programmes to provide the next generation of global health leaders with the necessary skills and knowledge to meet future global health challenges. SDGHI's education and training programmes provide students, medical residents and fellows, faculty, researchers, policy makers and practitioners with interdisciplinary and innovative scholarship and opportunities for individual research and practice experiences to enhance their learning and prepare them for a range of career options.

CAPACITY BUILDING

The Institute aims to increase the capacity of our partner institutions in the region through long-term collaborations lasting 5 years or more. Our focus is on strengthening these institutions through knowledge and skills transfer in research, education and policy. Other areas for strengthening include institutions' systems infrastructure and capacities for data management, laboratory support and research grant management.


OUR STRENGTHS
