PROFESSOR NG WAI HOE TO SUCCEED PROFESSOR IVY NG AS THE NEXT GROUP CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF SINGHEALTH

Singapore, 3 July 2023 – SingHealth today announced two key leadership changes. Professor Ivy Ng will be passing the baton to Professor Ng Wai Hoe as the Group Chief Executive Officer, SingHealth, after 12 years of outstanding service. Professor Ng Wai Hoe is currently the Deputy Group Chief Executive Officer (Strategy & Planning) [DGCEO (S&P)], SingHealth, and Chief Executive Officer (CEO), Changi General Hospital (CGH). He will be appointed as Group Chief Executive Officer (Designate), SingHealth, on 1 August 2023 and subsequently as Group Chief Executive Officer, SingHealth, on 1 February 2024. He will relinquish his appointments as DGCEO (S&P), SingHealth, and CEO, CGH, on the same date.

Taking over Prof Ng Wai Hoe as CEO, CGH, is Clinical Associate Professor Ng Kee Chong, who is currently Deputy Group Chairman Medical Board (Disease Outbreak and Preparedness) [DGCMB (DO&P)], SingHealth. Clin Assoc Prof Ng will be appointed CEO (Designate), CGH, on 1 August 2023, and subsequently CEO, CGH, on 1 February 2024. He will continue in his role as DGCMB (DO&P).

Compassion, an unwavering belief in the importance of staff well-being and engagement as well as her unstinting support for staff during challenging times are the distinctive hallmarks of her leadership. Mr Cheng added, "Professor Ng Wai Hoe is an exemplary clinician leader and researcher. I look forward to him harnessing his extensive experience as well as excellent understanding of clinical and management perspectives, with his unique brand of leadership, to lead and propel SingHealth to greater heights of clinical and academic medicine achievements as the new Group Chief Executive Officer."

Prof Ng Wai Hoe is a respected neurosurgeon who has paved the way for world-class research programmes in Parkinson's Disease and Neuro-oncology and developing, through strategic partnerships, research in areas such as brain-computer interface, artificial intelligence and other innovative technologies at the National Neuroscience Institute where he was Medical Director.

Professor Ivy Ng is an accomplished clinician-leader with a strong vision and deep passion for academic medicine. During her tenure as Group Chief Executive Officer, SingHealth, the cluster has welcomed Sengkang General Hospital and SingHealth Community Hospitals, with plans in place for the new Eastern General Hospital. She also oversaw infrastructure rejuvenation for the new CGH Medical Centre, the Punggol and Eunos Polyclinics, the new National Cancer Centre Singapore, as well as the re-development of Singapore General Hospital (SGH) Campus, including the SGH Emergency Medicine Building, slated to be ready in 2024 and the SGH Elective Care Centre and new National Dental Centre Singapore in 2027. Prof Ivy has also brought about considerable rationalisation, streamlining, and strengthening of cluster organisation, systems and processes, resulting in quantum leaps in efficiencies, optimisation and synergies across the full spectrum of healthcare services provided by SingHealth.

Professor Ng Wai Hoe is a respected neurosurgeon, a clinician-leader and researcher. Under Prof Ng's dynamic leadership, CGH has consolidated its reputation as a leader in healthcare innovation and in pushing the frontiers of regional and community care. In March 2023, for the fifth year running, CGH was ranked World's Best Hospitals (Singapore) 2023 by Newsweek. CGH has also been consistently ranked among the best in Newsweek's World's Best Smart Hospitals (Artificial Intelligence), and World's Best Specialised Hospitals (Pulmonology, Neurosurgery, Orthopaedics, Oncology). In 2023, CGH was recognised by Statista as one of Singapore's Best Employers.

Prof Ng Wai Hoe led CGH to forge a 10-year strategic collaboration with SingHealth Polyclinics and Singapore Prison Services, to provide enhanced medical services to prison inmates. He has led the way for CGH to partner different stakeholders to establish numerous key population health programmes including the Neighbours For Active Living, an initiative with South East Community Development Council to support vulnerable seniors with complex health-social needs; CareLine, a personal care telephone service providing 24/7 urgent support to vulnerable seniors; and YoOP!, a youth outreach designed to improve mental health literacy and identify and support peers at risk. The CGH-NNI Integrated Spine Centre and Wound Healing Centres were established during his tenure which have elevated and established new standards of care. CGH also signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore (CAAS) to provide Aviation Medicine Services to Airline Pilots and Air Traffic Controllers in Changi Airport.

Prior to CGH, Prof Ng Wai Hoe was the Medical Director at the National Neuroscience Institute (NNI). He also served as Deputy Group Chairman Medical Board, SingHealth, and led the establishment of several SingHealth Duke-NUS Disease Centres. Prof Ng has published extensively and sits on the Editorial Boards of several major neurosurgery journals, such as the Journal of Clinical Neuroscience and CNS Oncology. He has wide administrative experience at the national level having served as the Chairman of the MOH Residency Advisory Committee – Neurosurgery; Chairman of the Chapter of Neurosurgeons (Singapore); Panel of Chairmen of Disciplinary Tribunal with the Singapore Medical Council and Co-chairperson of the Workgroup to Review the Taking of Informed Consent and SMC Disciplinary Processes, among many other roles.
