Case Study

68 year old Chinese male, with metastatic prostate cancer is on androgen deprivation therapy (ADT) and novel anti androgen therapy. He is planned for radiation treatment to the prostate. He is on regular follow up with his family physician for diabetes and hypertension. At his regular review, he is noted to have worsening sugar and blood pressure control.
