

Emergency Department

- Stiff neck
- Weakness or numbness in the limbs
- Fits or seizures



See a GP

- Unusually high blood pressure readings
- · Headache or giddiness

Go to the **Emergency Department**

- Weakness or numbness
- · Difficulty with speech, sight or movement
- Chest pain or shortness of breath
- · Severe giddiness or headache

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

Cuts and Open Wounds

Cuts are wounds where the skin is lacerated or torn while open wounds are caused by injury to the skin and may lead to an infection.

See a GP

- Cuts from an animal or dirty item
- Persistent bleeding
- An infection
- A fever

Emergency Department

- Painful swelling
- Severe bleeding
- Visibility of fat and underlying structures like tendons
- A foreign body in the wound

Bruises

Bruises are caused by bleeding from the blood vessels beneath the skin.



See a GP

- Severe pain
- Fever
- · Red painful streaks or pus in the bruise

Painful swelling of the bruised area which affects vour movement

Diarrhoea and Vomiting

Diarrhoea and vomiting often occur because of bacterial infections of the gut, food intolerance and as side effects of certain medications.

Emergency Department

- · Large amounts of blood in your stools :
- Severe dehydration with weakness

Abdominal Pain or Indigestion

Abdominal pain and indigestion are commonly caused by trapped wind. overeating, alcohol use and infections.

Strains and **Sprains**

Yikesss!

Strains and sprains are injuries affecting muscles and ligaments and may involve pain, swelling, brdising, soreness and restricted movement.

- Swelling or numbness

There is no need to visit the

for a strain or sprain. unless instructed by your GP

Cellulitis

Cellulitis is a bacterial skin infection which causes swelling and pain in the affected area around the skin.
